IAMCR PRESIDENTIAL WELCOME LETTER

Carta de bienvenida de la Presidenta de la AIECS

■ It is most appropriate that the 2009 IAMCR conference in Mexico takes human rights as its focus. Human rights have become a key theme in political, social and economic development around the world, often recognised as much in their breach as in their application.

The discourse of human rights was formalised in the 1940s after the atrocities of World War Two, together with the recognition of "genocide", a term first developed in 1944, and the notion of "crimes against humanity". Yet the history of the notion of human rights reaches back into history and has been utilised by philosophers and theorists from a range of cultural traditions, while the formalization of human rights can be found in the development of international humanitarian law as it developed from the mid-nineteenth century.

Human rights enjoy universal recognition even as different cultural and political systems articulate varying notions of rights. The original formulation have been extended to recognise rights of specific groups that include women, children and indigenous peoples.

Rights are at the centre of many contemporary debates. Some argue that discourses about rights are too individualised and omit a concern for collectivities. Others are concerned that political rights have become prioritised over economic provision, even that a rights discourse has become a weapon of powerful states to promote specific forms of development. Yet others worry that rights mean little without attendant obligations. Many people struggle to achieve human rights while for others, existing rights are sometimes taken for-granted and even eroded with little resistance.

For our academic and practitioner fields of study and engagement, the issues around human rights are particularly acute. In many countries, journalists and other media professionals are still threatened by severe constraints on expression. Concern is mount-

■ Es muy pertinente que la Conferencia 2009 de la AIECS en México, tenga en su centro de reflexión los derechos humanos, pues constituyen un tema clave en el desarrollo político, social y económico.

Después de las atrocidades cometidas durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial, el discurso de los derechos humanos se formalizó en los años 40, al lado del reconocimiento del genocidio, un término desarrollado por primera vez en 1944, y de la noción de crímenes contra las humanidad. El nacimiento de los derechos humanos se halla en la propia historia y han sido utilizados por filósofos y teóricos provenientes de diversas tradiciones culturales, mientras que su formalización deriva del derecho humanitario internacional desarrollado a partir de la segunda mitad del siglo XIX.

Los derechos humanos gozan de reconocimiento universal, lo que se ve reflejado en la articulación de diversas nociones de derechos de distintas culturas y sistemas políticos. La formulación original ha sido extendida para lograr el reconocimiento de los derechos de grupos específicos, que incluyen a las mujeres, a los niños y a los grupos indígenas.

Los derechos humanos son el centro de muchos debates contemporáneos. Algunos argumentan que los discursos alrededor de los derechos son en extremo individualizados y que omiten el sentido de colectividad. Otros se confiesan consternados por el hecho de que los derechos políticos han sido priorizados sobre las necesidades económicas, aún cuando el discurso de los derechos se ha convertido en el arma de estados poderosos para promover formas específicas de desarrollo. Algunos más han centrado su atención en el hecho de que aquéllos significan poco si no apuntan

ing about the erosion of information rights and privacy rights in the current digital era. Intellectual property rights are a site of confrontation between capital and creativity. A long-standing philosophical and legal debate rages around the meaning and the practice of the "right to communicate". In multicultural societies and in a globalised environment, however, the freedom of expression exercised by some confronts the cultural sensitivities of others, sometimes with violent consequences.

Thus the complex of issues around human rights lies at the heart of the research and policy concerns of IAMCR. They also present a challenge for us as an international organization that seeks to intervene in policy domains and to have a voice in international debates: how do we decide what our positions should be?

These are amongst the most crucial issues of our time and it is vital that we give them the analytic attention they require. I invite you all to participate in what will undoubtedly be a fascinating conference.

The Conference Theme

HUMAN RIGHTS AND COMMUNICATION

■ Along with the issues corresponding to the IAMCR's Sections and Working Groups, the organisers of the Mexico Conference propose that the participants devote time to the discussion of a topic of great importance for world-wide coexistence: Human Rights and Communication.

The adoption of the United Nations (UN) Charter in 1945 and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) in 1948, obliged all States to establish, protect and enforce Human Rights at global, regional, national and local levels. Since then, the recognition of the inherent dignity and the equal and inalienable rights of every person, has forced the international community to recognise and assume its responsibility in the promotion of universal respect and the protection of human rights. Also, to guarantee the indivisibility of human rights and their interdependence with peace and development.

Human rights provide a "universally available set of standards for the dignity and integrity of all human beings" (Hamelink, 1994). The fulfilment of these standards, based on the principles of freedom, equality, solidarity and inviolability, and of inclusiveness, diversity, universality and participation is directly linked to the possibilities of communication as a right. In this sense, the MacBride Report (1980) says that the right to communicate is a prerequisite for other human rights. In particular, we must recognise the connection that exists between the right to communicate and those human rights that guarantee public participation. Henceforth, the right to communicate involves other basic human rights, such as: freedom of expression, the right to information, and the universal access to information and knowledge, but the involvement of citizens in decision-making processes about communication and information policies, the promotion of the cultural diversity by media and NTIC's, the access of social groups that have historically been excluded from the public sphere –such as women, indigenous

DERECHOS HUMANOS Y COMUNICACIÓN

■ El Comité Local invita a los participantes a destinar la discusión y el análisis de la Conferencia, a un tema central para la co-existencia universal: Derechos Humanos y Comunicación.

La adopción de los estatutos de las Naciones Unidas en 1945 y de la Declaración Universal de los Derechos Humanos en 1948, obligó a los Estados miembro a reconocer, establecer, proteger y fortalecer los derechos humanos a nivel global, regional, nacional y local. Desde entonces, el respeto a la dignidad de las personas y a su derecho a la igualdad, han impulsado a la comunidad internacional a reconocer y asumir su responsabilidad en la promoción, respeto y protección universal de los derechos humanos. Asimismo, a garantizar la indivisibilidad de los derechos humanos y su interdependencia con la paz y el desarrollo.

Como lo señala Hamelink (1994), los derechos humanos proveen un marco universal de estándares para la integridad y la dignidad de todos los seres humanos. Este marco se encuentra basado en los principios de libertad, igualdad, equidad, solidaridad, inviolabilidad, inclusión, diversidad, participación y comunicación. En este tenor, el Informe MacBride (1980) expresa que el derecho a comunicar es un pre-requisito para la realización de otros derechos humanos. En particular, debemos reconocer la relación que existe entre el derecho a comunicar y aquellos que garantizan la participación pública. Así, el derecho a comunicar va de la mano de la libertad de expresión, el derecho a la información y el acceso universal a las tecnologías y al conocimiento, pero también, de la participación de los ciudadanos en los procesos de toma de decisión relacionados con las políticas de comunicación e información, de la promoción de la diversidad cultural por parte de los medios de comu-

and young people- to resources and tools to realize their right to communicate, and the protection of privacy and confidentiality of communication are involved too.

The importance of communication as a basic human right is established in article 19 of the UDHR, which declares that "everyone has the right to freedom of expression and opinion; this right includes the freedom to hold opinions without interference and to seek, receive and impart information and ideas through any media and regardless of frontiers".

However, while recognising the importance of communication in contemporary societies and how it should impact them in positive ways, we must not ignore its negative aspects which result in the inability of many groups to exercise their communicative rights.

Peace, democracy and development will only be achieved if we guarantee the principles of communication as a human right, that is the right to communicate for all. Consequently, we consider that it is imperative to promote the analysis, discussion and formulation of information and communication strategies and policies, from the human rights' perspective. This is a responsibility we can no longer delay.

La importancia de la comunicación como derecho humano se encuentra establecido en el Artículo 19 de la Declaración Universal de los Derechos Humanos, que expresa que "cada persona tiene el derecho a la libertad de expresión y de opinión; este derecho incluye la libertad de tener opiniones sin interferencia y a recibir e impartir información e ideas a través de cualquier medio, sin que medien fronteras".

Sin embargo, al mismo tiempo que reconocemos la importancia de la comunicación en las sociedades contemporáneas y su impacto positivo, no debemos ignorar los aspectos negativos que resultan de la falta de acceso de muchos grupos sociales al ejercicio de sus derechos comunicativos.

Por ello, consideramos que la paz, la democracia y el desarrollo sólo serán realizados si garantizamos los principios de la comunicación como un derecho humano, esto es, del derecho a la comunicación de todas las personas. Pensamos que es imperativo promover el análisis, la discusión y la formulación de estrategias y políticas de comunicación e información desde la perspectiva de los derechos humanos. Es una responsabilidad que no podemos aplazar.



UNIVERSIDAD NACIONAL AUTÓNOMA DE MÉXICO

■ According to its Organic Legislation, the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México is a public corporation, a decentralized State agency, sanctioned with full legal powers, providing higher education to teach professionals, researchers, university teaching staff, and technicians who are useful to society; organizing and carrying out research, principally on national conditions and problems; and disseminating the benefits of culture as broadly as possible".

Its autonomy is characterized by its academic freedom and independence. It is the only university in Mexico with Nobel Prize laureates: Alfonso García Robles (Peace), Octavio Paz (Literature) and Mario Molina (Chemistry).

Besides being the most recognized university in Iberoamerica, it is one of the largest and the most artistically detailed. Its main campus is a World Heritage. Some of the most recognized artists in Mexican history, such as David Alfaro Siqueiros and Diego Rivera painted murals in the main campus, known as Ciudad Universitaria.

The Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México was recently awarded with the Príncipe de Asturias Prize.

■ En su Ley Orgánica, se expresa que "la Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México es una corporación pública, organismo descentralizado del Estado, dotado de plena capacidad jurídica y que tiene por fines impartir educación superior para formar profesionistas, investigadores, profesores universitarios y técnicos útiles a la sociedad; organizar y realizar investigaciones, principalmente acerca de las condiciones y problemas nacionales, y extender con la mayor amplitud posible los beneficios de la cultura".

Su autonomía se refleja en los principios de libertad de cátedra y de investigación. Es la única universidad en México que ha formado a ganadores del Premio Nobel: Alfonso García Robles (Paz), Octavio Paz (Literatura) y Mario Molina (Química).

Además de ser la universidad con mayor reconocimiento en Iberoamérica, es una de las más grandes y bellas. El campus principal, Ciudad Universitaria, ha sido declarado Patrimonio Cultural de la Humanidad por la UNESCO. Algunos de los más reconocidos artistas de la historia de México, como David Alfaro Siqueiros y Diego Rivera son los autores de los murales que figuran en el campus central.

La Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México fue galardonada en 2009 con el Premio Príncipe de Asturias.

CENTRO CULTURAL UNIVERSITARIO TLATELOLCO

■ Inaugurated in 2007, the Centro Cultural Universitario Tlatelolco occupies the former Foreign Relations Secretariat building. A component of the UNAM, the cultural project has the main purpose to benefit the communitarian life of the Central-North part of the City.

The cultural center contains two interesting permanent exhibits. The Colección Andrés Blaisten, on the first floor, comprises the largest privately owned collection of Mexican 20th-century art. Downstairs, the Memorial del 68 both chronicles and memorializes the 1968 student massacre at Tlatelolco.

The building is surrounded by the archeological zone of Tlatelolco and the Plaza of the Three Cultures.

■ El Centro Cultural Universitario Tlatelolco (CCUT) es un proyecto estratégico de la Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM). El complejo arquitectónico que por casi cuatro décadas ocupó la Secretaría de Relaciones Exteriores (SRE) se incorporó al patrimonio inmobiliario universitario en noviembre de 2006, con el propósito exclusivo de crear un gran espacio cultural que anime y enriquezca, a través de diversos proyectos culturales, la vida comunitaria de la zona norte de la capital del país, ampliando el alcance de los programas académicos de la institución y dando cumplimiento a uno de los más importantes principios del espíritu universitario.

El CCUT está delimitado al norte por la bella zona arqueológica de Tlatelolco y la Plaza de las Tres Culturas.

TENANGOS

*The IAMCR Conference's bags, embroidered by hand!
¡Los bolsos de la Conferencia IAMCR, hechos a mano!*

■ Ford Foundation has joined to our Conference, by financing the bags that have been provided to the attendees. These bags are produced by craftswomen specialized in embroideries named Tenangos. With this project, we pretend to promote the work of these women from the community of San Nicolas, belonging to Tenango de Doria Municipality, Hidalgo, located in the Mexican Otomí region. The construction of the network with this group of women was obtained thanks to the support of the Government of Hidalgo State, through the Hidalgo International Corporation.

What Tenangos are?

They are handmade embroideries arisen as an economic alternative for the population of San Nicolas, Hidalgo. Nowadays, it is a handicraft that identifies all the communities belonging to Tenango de Doria, particularly, the embroiderer women are recognized by the characteristics of its work and distinguished from others, -because of the closed of their embroideries- the drawers are identified by their outlines, but mainly, because of the animals, people, real and mythical, which comprise their life and Otomí cosmovision.

"Metritos" - today named "Tenangos", because of the region where they come from-, are used to make tablecloths, cushions, blankets, bed sheets, shawls, handbags, among others.

■ La Fundación Ford se ha unido a los trabajos de la Conferencia, financiando los bolsos que les han sido entregados a los participantes. Se trata de morrales producidos por mujeres bordadoras especialistas en Tenangos. Con este proyecto, se impulsa el trabajo de las artesanas de la población de San Nicolás, perteneciente a Tenango de Doria, Hidalgo, en la región Otomí. El acuerdo con esta red de productoras se logró gracias también al apoyo de la COINHI del gobierno del estado de Hidalgo.

¿Qué son los Tenangos?

Son bordados que surgieron como una alternativa económica para la población de San Nicolás, Hidalgo. Actualmente, es un trabajo que identifica a todas las comunidades pertenecientes a Tenango de Doria, y en particular, a las mujeres bordadoras, quienes son identificadas por las características del trabajo que realizan –algunas hacen un bordado más cerrado que el de otras-, y a los dibujantes, que son reconocidos por sus trazos, pero sobre todo, a sus animales y personajes, reales y míticos, que forman parte de la vida y la cosmovisión Otomí.

Los metritos –hoy llamados “Tenangos”, para hacer hin-capié en la región de donde son originarios- son utilizados para elaborar manteles, cojines, sábanas, rebozos, sarapes, bolsas, morrales, entre otros

One of the issues that have been at the forefront of controversy and concern in the media industry is the degree to which the media content and its workforce reflect the dynamic diversity of the society they are supposed to serve. The media in general, and public service media in particular, constitute an important link in the relationship between citizens and politics. Political and public debates influence each other through the media which, in this respect, can be seen as 'agenda-setters'. The media prescribe which topics politicians and the public consider important and have a considerable impact on public opinion on these subjects. Moreover, it is also the media that bring the 'country of origin' into the immigrant's living room via satellite dish, the airwaves or the Internet.

This working group will examine how public service media deal with the changing composition of their respective societies that are – especially in a European context – changing from mono- to multicultural. We will examine the efforts public service broadcasters, or for that matter: public service media, make to improve the symbolic representation of the 'majority' as well as of the 'minority' in each other's eyes and to achieve greater social-cultural participation of ethnic and other minorities, but also look at the government's contribution to fostering a more inclusive media output.

Although the working group is by tradition focused at European public broadcasting policies we welcome contributions on the topic from everywhere in the world.
